

# **Preparing for the Fall Festivals**

#### I. FALL FESTIVALS OVERVIEW

#### A. Elul

- 1. A time of preparation
- 2. Cleansing our hearts through repentance

Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me. (Psalm 51:10-12)

3. Prepare our hearts for the coming King

## B. Yom Teruah (Trumpets): Yeshua as returning King. (Lev. 23:4-5; Num. 29:1-6)

- 1. Reflects God's desire to summon His people to repentance so He can vindicate them on the Day of Judgment.
- 2. An alert that the Heavenly Trial is beginning.
- 3. God is a merciful God who wants us to come to His Son to escape the judgment we deserve.

## C. Yom Kippur: Yeshua as Judge and Redeemer. (Ex. 30:10; Lev. 16; Lev. 23:26-32; Num. 29:7-11)

1. We are purified!

Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice.

- 2. Underscores the seriousness of sin by showing need for confession, repentance, and forgiveness.
- **D. Sukkot: Yeshua as Bridegroom/Protector.** Lev. 23:33-36, 39-43; Num. 29:12-39; Deut. 16:13-15; 31:9-13).
  - 1. He will place his tent with ours.
  - 2. The closest possible relationship
  - 3. Celebration of the blessings of the Messianic Age, i.e., the return of Yeshua.
  - 4. Rejoicing at the redemption offered by Yeshua

### E. Shemini Atzeret (the Eighth Day):

1. Represents the Age to Come

#### II. THE FALL FESTIVALS: NOT A CHECK-OFF

#### A. A call to repent, cleanse our hearts

- 1. Yeshua is returning for His bride
- 2. Our job is to prepare to receive Him
  - a. Parable of 10 virgins
  - b. Oil is a metaphor for being firm in faith, having tenacity in endurance, and righteousness in living
- 3. Being watchful
  - a. Watchmen on the walls had two jobs
    - 1) Anticipating the attacks of the enemy, and
    - 2) Watching for the arrival of visiting dignitaries
  - b. Keep our souls as pure as possible by being aware of Satan's schemes
  - c. Be on the look-out for ministry opportunities
  - d. John 5:19
- 4. Be repentant
  - a. Of committed sins
  - b. Of missed opportunities to bless

- 5. Seek God's will
  - a. Watch and pray

#### **B.** Remember the themes!

- 1. There is no way around it!
  - a. Yeshua is returning as King.
  - b. He is coming back as judge
    - 1) We were engaged at Passover; now he's coming to collect his bride
  - c. Some will be brought into eternity with him
  - d. Some will be cast away
- 2. We know these things; every year at this time we are reminded
- 3. How to be ready?
  - a. Increase time with him, seek his face, desire to please him? Are those things enough?
  - b. What are we buying when we go buy oil
- 4. The wise virgins
  - a. Not possible to be on constant alert; all have lives and distractions
  - b. Is possible to already be prepared
  - c. The struggle is intended to keep us clinging to him/focused on his will
  - d. Maturity in the Lord is not based on age but on obedience
  - e. No one can rely on someone else's preparation
  - f. There is such a thing as 'too late'
- 5. Being prepared/buying oil (see the next parable—the Talents)
  - a. Must produce results which the Master can see and improve
  - b. Put to good use the gifts each has been given
  - c. The Master allocates the scale of responsibility
  - d. The disciple faithfully discharges his responsibility
  - e. Circumstances and personalities differ, so the Master's assigned responsibilities differ
    - 1) Not everyone is an apostle, prophet, evangelist, teacher, or pastor; but everyone has something to offer
- 6. Buying oil is not getting something new but faithful use of what we already have
  - a. The servant who didn't do anything with his gift was rebuked
  - b. The ones who used their gifts were blessed

#### C. The most basic theme!

- 1. Yeshua is returning to a totally broken world
  - a. The joy in anticipating his return is meant to stabilize and center us in the face of difficulty
  - b. Just before his return the days will be so dark—all will be affected
  - c. We will have to depend on what we already have
- 2. Can't depend on others to make us ready
- 3. Seek intimacy with Him
